I'm not sure who is best placed to deal with this request but would like to formally ask for a brief meeting with Rupert when he visits Australia next week.

As you know I'm a director of the Australian Shareholders' Association and News Corp monitor for the ASA.

ASA procedure usually includes a pre-AGM meeting with the chairman, something which has never happened with News Corp

The ASA is very pleased with the continuing push to populate the News Corp board with more independent directors and were delighted to read in the proxy statement that the demerger will deliver a super-majority of independent directors at both companies.

Rather than incur the expense and time of a trip to LA for the annual public debate with Mr Murdoch at the AGM, this year I would propose not doing that if I can instead be granted a brief opportunity to privately engage on governance and performance issues during the visit to Australia next week.
